#### Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Program

Safe drinking-water, sanitation and hygiene are crucial to human health and well-being. Safe WASH is not only a prerequisite to health, but contributes to livelihoods and helps to create resilient communities living in healthy environments.

The WASH program works on providing clean water for drinking, cooking and personal hygiene in order to maintain a healthy life and reduce the transmission of water-borne diseases.

Issues related to environmental sanitation where there are provisions for latrines and to develop and promote the prevention of ill health through awareness-raising. Requirements for personal hygiene and waste removal are some basic services provided to beneficiaries

We're proud to have Memoranda of Understanding (MoU) with the Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Environment. ## ACHIEVEMENTS AND IMPACT

#### **Forest Restoration and Watershed Management**

- · Planting of 13,280,000 trees.
- · Enrichment or protection of 6640 hectares of forest.
- · Protection of 18 major watersheds.
- · Over 126,000 individuals directly benefitting from our interventions.

#### **Livelihood Improvement Program:**

- Directly reached over 126000 beneficiaries.
- Collaborated with 15 farmer cooperatives.
- Facilitated the adoption of new climate-smart agriculture practices by 2500 households.
- Distributed 36,000 fish fingerlings and 250 pigs to diversify cooperative livelihoods.
- Installed 6 solar-powered irrigation systems.
- Constructed 15 new water harvesting dams.
- Supplied 2300 fuel-efficient cookstoves.
- Trained 85 farmers in sustainable land management and integrated farming.
- Converted more than 1200 hectares to climate-resilient agroforestry systems.





## ACHIEVEMENTS AND IMPACT

#### **Climate Change Adaptation Program**

- Supported 222 households with integrated adaptation packages.
- Enabled over 3,500 farmers to adopt climate-smart agriculture practices.
- Constructed 14 new community dams.
- Rehabilitated 1200 hectares of degraded land through agroforestry.
- Collaborated with 20 farmer cooperatives on adaptation initiatives.
- Developed 7 micro-watershed management plans.
- Achieved a 35% productivity increase in targeted farms.
- Avoided emissions equivalent to 12 600 tonnes of CO2. annually

#### **Sustainable Agriculture Program**

- Direct benefits to 5,200 farmers.
- Formation and strengthening of 20 new farmer cooperatives.
- Conversion of over 1200 hectares to climate-smart agroforestry systems.
- Management of 1000 hectares under sustainable land practices.
- Planting of 8,500 fruit and wood trees.
- Distribution of 2300 fuel-efficient cookstoves.
- Establishment of 20 farmer field schools focused on climate smart agriculture
- Establishment of 4 new smallholder irrigation schemes




